Judges Critique

It would seem that the Manchester Committee has been vindicated in its decision to move to Stafford from the Gmex Centre, if the significantly increased overall entry is the measure. Some difficulties have been reported in the Dog Press; hardly surprising when the Society had to squeeze a four-day entry into three days. All of the Officers and Committee Members I encountered were extremely welcoming and courteous, and seemed to be running affairs in an efficient fashion. Many thanks to them for inviting me early in November 2003, to replace Mike Burdon, who unfortunately had to withdraw.

The judging was delayed for around thirty minutes or so, owing to road congestion outside the showground. The ring provided was of excellent size, The hall, familiar to many of us as the venue for the NOEDC Ch Show, has a good non-slip floor surface, adequate light, and was warm enough, on a pretty cold day. Janet Kay and Linda Moore were wonderful stewards, keeping things moving, in a cheerful and efficient manner. I know that they had several visitations during the day reminding them that another breed was scheduled to follow in the ring. Many thanks to both of you for your invaluable help and assistance.

I was pleased with an entry of 150, and even more delighted to find that absentees totalled only 20 or so overall, considering this was Mid-January, with not the best of weather forecasts being broadcast in the days prior to Saturday. Thanks to all who sought my opinion, you certainly made it a considerable challenge, particularly in the upper classes of both sexes, where it was easy to choose five for placing, as there were so many good ones, but much more difficult to decide which five. Congratulations to those who took a card home, and commiserations to those who didn't, and accepted the decision with the best of grace. It was encouraging to see well-filled puppy classes once again; a contrast to the position a couple of years ago.

My overall impression was that size has become a little more uniform, with fewer extremes noticed. Temperaments were first class, condition was largely very good, but very few were in what is sometimes described as hard muscular condition. Spotting was good on the whole, with the livers varying in shade somewhat (this has been a chestnut for some time hasn't it?) and one recurring feature I noticed in several exhibits was poor upper arm angulation, which on some fronts was barely an angle at all!

As a general observation, I don't think our breed has changed very much in overall quality in the 24 years that I have been involved. What we have, I believe is more variation, which is possibly the result of a reduction in the number of larger kennels, who are more able to put a stamp on the type they produce; a general change, I imagine, not confined to Dalmatians. We undoubtedly have some very good ones, who are already Champions, or will be in the future.

VETERAN DOG 6 (1 abs)

1. MacLENNAN, & COWAN's Ch Jakes Dream Among Haiths JW

Average sized, very compact and strongly built 8y/o, with even black spotting. Very good angulation front and rear. Moved correctly with considerable drive and power. Expertly handled.

2. HERNANDEZ Ch Dalminshi Gypsy Roamer

A taller more elegant type of 91/2yrs, but balanced, and presented in excellent condition, with good black spotting on the whitest of backgrounds. Another excellent mover who proceeds around the ring with a rhythmic long stride. Little to separate these two splendid veterans.

3. BEESTON's Master Plan at Sanadal

MINOR PUPPY DOG 5 (0 abs)

1. HALE's Mapplewell It Takes Two

A well grown black spotted 9m old. Happy confident youngster who moved very well. A good overall shape, with nicely angled hindquarters, and plenty of depth in the chest. Pleasing head, good decoration and a correct tail carriage. Shown to advantage. Best puppy dog.

2. McMILLAN's Oneowun Mr Bojangles at Dalyance NAF

Slightly smaller type of 7m. Dense black spotting, excellent tail set and quarters, with good overall balance. Very much a baby at this stage, and conceding a lot to 1 in maturity. Has the necessary attributes to progress in the show ring.

3. HAMMETT's Bryedal Mayan

PUPPY DOG 9 (0 abs)

1. CAULDWELL's Gwencarodale Pop's Pride

A nicely marked 10m black spotted. Substantial and well up to size, pleasing head, and lovely temperament. Presented and moved in a calm fashion to advantage. Shapely hindquarters. Tail perhaps a little high on the move.

2. PAGE's Winflash Spring Wonder

Profusely, but evenly marked black spotted 9m old. of average size with a very clean and sharp outline illustrating a good tail set and angulation at the front and rear. Very fit condition, and showed with some enthusiasm and moved in a brisk fashion.

3. ALCOCK's Dalkereve Dare To Demand At Dalspartan

JUNIOR DOG 11 (2 abs)



1. BROOKESâ€™ Hispot Hispirits

A 14m b/s in sound bodily condition. Commands attention as he displays many virtues, among them correct movement, ideal tail-set, strong limbs, and an excellent show temperament.

2. PIGDENâ€™s Tyrodal Mercury Cougar

Different type, being a shorter backed, more compact, powerfully built liver spotted of 12m. Another sound exhibit, who moved with purpose and drive. Held tail a little high on the move.

3. ALEXANDERâ€™s Offordale Blenheim

SPECIAL YEARLING DOG 5 (0 abs)

1. HARTLEY & GRIFFITHSâ€™ Miragua The Explorer

Smart and stylish, with good overall construction, and everything in proportion. Much to like about this one, being of an average size, totally balanced, with attractive black spotting, and a first class temperament. Well handled, and moved with a good stride. Should have a rewarding show career, as he is still not quite 2 yrs old. RCC.

2. PARKIN-RUSSELLâ€™s Elaridge Viceroy

A nice type, well-constructed medium sized b/s, not overdone in any way. Almost the same age as one, moved steadily, showed well, and displayed a happy temperament. A little unlucky to meet 1 in such top form.

3. BALE-STOCKâ€™s Spring Celebration at Appaloosa

POST GRADUATE DOG 9 (3 abs)

1. GREEN & SEARSâ€™ Dalspa Oratorio

Evenly marked, well up to size b/s who presents the most lovely and balanced shape, with no exaggeration, Carries his tail correctly. Was a shade erratic on the move today.

2. WILLISâ€™s Cibrith Caterer

Similar type to 1 but b/s and of a heavier build. Sound construction with very good quarters. Movement steadier than 1, but a touch proud of his tail on the move.

3. MOSELEYâ€™s Loxleyvale Khandahar

LIMIT DOG 17 (1 abs)

A very competitive class, with some good ones leaving card less

1. WIGHT & DARBY â€™s Quiet Gentleman JW

A liver spotted, who is extremely well put together. He was probably the best mover here today, demonstrating a smooth powerful action, maintaining body shape at all times. Strong loin, deep chest, and well angled hindquarters. Would have preferred a little more refinement in head and expression.

2. HARRISON-STRATFORDâ€™s Dalkereve Dark Discovery

B/s, slightly smaller than 1. An excellent make and shape, and in the best of condition, in top form. Nicely balanced, great tail, and quarters. Moved well, but could not quite match 1 in this department

3. CLELANDâ€™s Deovolante Don Alfonso JW

OPEN DOG 7 (0 abs)

Excellent class

1. GOFF-LEGGETT Ch Washakie Chief As Great As JW

An impressive looking b/s dog who is still under 2 yrs. Striking appearance with a flawless coat and dense pigmentation. Excels in tail, quarters, and overall bodily condition. Attractive head and expression. A top performer, who stands to perfection, and moves with good reach and drive. CC & BOB

2. TAYLOR & MACKINNONâ€™s Ch Frankish Desert Trouper

A striking b/s of average size, in excellent condition, superb head and spotting. Presented in a calm and assured fashion, moving well at all times. A worthy champion, but could not quite match the overall performance of 1 today.

3. LEWISâ€™s Hunterswood Talk of the Town JW

VETERAN BITCH 4 (2)

1. ROACHâ€™s Holderness Harpsicord

A liver spotted lady of 8 1/2yrs. Average size, deep chested, and in good overall condition. Presented a balanced picture standing, and has lost none of her ability to display very good movement. Happy temperament.

2. PAVEYâ€™s Pretty Polly Pavey of Polidot

Slightly smaller, 8y/o, with good even black spotting, moving steadily. Not showing herself as well as 1.

MINOR PUPPY BITCH 9 (1 abs)

1. BEAUMONTâ€™s Angcio de Cielo TAF

Smart and shapely b/s, nearly 8m. Very good bone, feet and depth of brisket, followed by the best of hindquarters and tail. A lively temperament, feminine head and dark eyes, finished off with excellent spotting. Average size and totally balanced. Moved confidently and correctly. Really got her act together to beat the rest, but lost concentration slightly when challenging for best puppy bitch.

2. NEATH-DUGGAN's Buffrey May Bee

Two very similar young puppies, and my comments are much the same. This b/s is 10m, and perhaps not quite so tall. Lovely temperament, without the intensity of 1, and to â€™split hairsâ€™ was carrying a little more weight. Effectively the choice between these two lovely puppies was marginal. I feel that both will do well in the future.

3. CHANCE & DODDSâ€™ Phaeland Phlorida Passion

PUPPY BITCH 15 (2 abs)



1. POLHILLâ€™s Kymvale Aurora

I believe the owner is relatively new to the Dalmatian show scene, however this 10m liver-spotted puppy performed with distinction. Sweet & feminine, moving with grace and style. A super shape with elegant neck and shoulders, great tail, and well angled hindquarters. Just the right bodily condition, and a show temperament that allows her to display her virtues to the best advantage. Topped some very nice youngsters to take best puppy.

2. GOFF-LEGGETTâ€™s Washakie Smiles A Lot

Another quality one of 9m from this kennel. Strong bone, excellent hindquarters, beautiful condition. and excellent black spotting. Was not as confident as 1 today and therefore did not present herself to such advantage.

3. PAGEâ€™s Winflash Spring Fury

JUNIOR BITCH 12 (2 abs)

1. GATFORDâ€™s Phaeland Phiddling Phorever

A very impressive b/s. Elegant in profile, with graceful head and neck, good shoulders, perfectly angled hind quarters and well carried tail, entirely balanced throughout, moved steadily. Has an ideal show temperament, and was able to perform in a most mature fashion. Of an average size, and seems to have all the qualities for a promising show career in the future

2. WILLISâ€™ Cibrith Hazel Nut

A larger, but equally well made l/s, who demonstrated a more expansive stride when moving than 1. An extrovert showgirl, who pushed hard, but I just preferred the balance and refinement of the winner.

3. LAMBâ€™s Leaveslake Lily at Dalpetro JW

POST GRADUATE BITCH 18 (4 abs)

1. DICKENS Washakie Iowa

Compact and slightly smaller than some, but with elegance and a clean outline. Well made throughout, and extremely feminine. Moved in a steady correct fashion, good tail carriage. Handled in a most competent manner, and stood to perfection

First class black spotting.

2. SMIRTHWAITEâ€™s Dalmark Queen of the Tarot

A somewhat larger l/s but correctly proportioned to provide the optimum balance. Presented in sparkling condition. Whilst a contrast in size, both of these bitches share the same qualities in construction, with this one having a more powerful and driving movement. A close decision.

3. BAKERâ€™s Oneowun Vienna

LIMIT BITCH 11 (0 abs)

A very competitive class.

1. DINSDALEâ€™s Dalesbred Doodle Bug

A very striking b/s with a quite outstanding shape of average size. Jet black spots on a glistening white background. The best of quarters and a perfect tail set. Entirely feminine, with dark eyes, and a flamboyant temperament with that slight devilment in it, demanding attention. Moved with a long stride. Top performance to take the CC.

2. BLACKâ€™s Boval Britannia

A similar size but shorter backed, l/s, and more compact. Ultra feminine with substance, and great construction throughout. Everything in the right place, excellent head neck and tail A quieter temperament, but fully attentive, and shown to best advantage. A very correct mover, but not the length of stride of 1. RCC

3. BAKERâ€™s Abbydal Angelica by Daleaf JW

OPEN BITCH 11 (1 abs)

Another class containing high quality exhibits

1. HIPKISSâ€™ Dalkiss Isla of Iona JW

Elegance and femininity describes this one. Even liver spotting, beautiful head, good quarters, tail, shoulders, and hindquarters. Perfect balance, a calm dignified show temperament. Topped a class containing many excellent bitches. Just pipped for top honours by the two from limit.

2. PAGEâ€™s Winter Magic JW

Not as tall and b/s. Beautiful shape, strongly made, compact and balanced. In fine muscular condition great hindquarters and good deep chest. Extrovert temperament. Moved correctly with considerable enthusiasm, perhaps going a little too fast today.

3. CHRISTIEâ€™s Ch Haiths Hallmarked by Sophtspot
